

ETTORE GERMANO- SERRALUNGA D'ALBA

About Sergio Germano, Owner & Winemaker of Ettore Germano:

My ideal winemaker in a traditional appellation like Barolo has the scientific understanding of winemaking that his predecessors lacked, while still respecting the traditions that they developed. Sergio Germano is just such a winemaker, and his Serralunga Barolos will never be creamy, international-style wines. Great wine is always made in the vineyard, and Sergio does much of the fieldwork himself, with the help of his wife Elena and a small crew. Some of the wines are 100% traditional, made with long macerations and big barrels, and some are made with medium-sized barrels, but they all express the best of these local grape varieties.

Winemaker Marco Parusso:

"My grandfather started in Barolo as a farmer, with 2 hectares. Then my father, in the 70's, made his first wine but we still depended on the farm. In 1985/86 I graduated from winemaking school, but I didn't like wine at all. Drinking a good wine was something difficult to find. Then a good friend of mine at the time, a doctor, introduced me to wines from Burgundy and it was there that I found my inspiration as a winemaker."

"The purity and intensity of all the wines are remarkable at every level. I openly confess to Giuliano that their wines are amazingly inexpensive. Giuliano jokes, 'ok, next year we'll put a 10% increase.' Tasting the flagship cru Giachini, I am rendered speechless. Their neighbor, Elio Altare comes to our table after tasting the 1990 Giachini and confesses, 'you do even better work than I do.' Ever humble and demure in his manner, Giuliano shrugs off such flattery but does not reject Elio's proposition." - Robert Panzer, Down To Earth Wines

LA SPINETTA- CASTAGNOLE DELLE LANZE (LANGHE)

Giorgio Rivetti, co-owner & winemaker at La Spinetta:

"We are farmers. That means first and foremost we respect the land. We don't kill it using chemicals or over-produce. We work with our hands, organically, and patiently." Giorgio recounts his first vintage of Barbaresco: "A few well-known Barolo producers came over to me very concerned as they couldn't believe how few grapes I had left on the vines. They thought I was crazy and throwing away money. But I knew from the start the kind of quality that I wanted in all of my wines. And nothing has changed since."



Gaia Gaja:

"My wine hero is my father, naturally, but also my grandfather, who passed away in 2002. I remember as a child watching the way he was tasting wine and the respect he had for every sip. He would go into the kitchen where we always had at least one bottle of Barbaresco open and he would pour two fingers of wine into the glass, never any more. And he would sniff and sniff, sip, and sniff and this process took forever! Then he would go back to the bottle again, pour two more fingers, put the cork back in, and start again. He would even do this with our guests, only pouring 2 fingers at a time, and some people didn't like this. But looking back now, I have such admiration for the way he was respecting and cherishing every drop of wine."

CONTRATTO - ALTA LANGA

Giorgio Rivetti - owner & head winemaker of Contratto:

"One of my biggest problems is that I love Champagne. I love bubbles, I always have. So when the opportunity presented itself to buy Contratto, I didn't think twice. It's always been my dream to make great Metedo Classico (Champagne-method) wines in Piedmont."

"The first thing we did was buy all new vineyards and plant new vines. 70% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay. All of the vines are planted between 820-840 meters above sea-level. Just as we do in Barolo and Barbaresco, the most important thing to make these amazing wines is to find the balance in the fruit. If you can grow beautiful fruit and harvest the fruit at the perfect moment when the grapes have the right balance between acidity, longevity, minerality, sweetness, my job in the cellar becomes much easier."

CONTRATTO - CANELLI (ASTI)

Giorgio Rivetti - on why spirits:

"It's very important to remember that sparkling wine and Vermouth have always grown up together. Before the fancy technology we have today, when the "champagne" was degorged, the wine that spilled out was collected in a bowl. Then when they finished all of the bottles, they didn't want to waste anything (remember it was a time of war and we were very poor) so they would take the all of the spilt wine in the bowl and add sugar and herbs to it and they would have their wine for winter. This "winter wine" is what we know today as vermouth.

When we bought Contratto, we also inherited a book this thick of recipes for vermouths and "elixirs" from 1890-1930s. We are using the exact same recipes today - using only natural, organic herbs, seeds, roots, spices. Some of them we had to source out of Italy because they are no longer produced, but we wanted to respect the recipes and those who created them."

You're Piemontese, why make wines in Tuscany? Winemaker/Owner Giorgio Riveetti:

"I needed to prove a point. One dinner, after many glasses of wine, a great friend of mine and I had a discussion where he insisted that in Tuscany it was impossible to make great Chianti without adding other grape varietals. I strongly disagreed with him and we had a big argument. The following morning the conversation was still was weighing on my mind so my brothers Bruno, Carlo and I decided to go on a road trip and see if we could find a piece of land that intrigued us and could lend itself to our experiment. That was in 2000. My friend today is also convinced that you can make fantastic Chianti with 100% Sangiovese. It's been very exciting for me as a winemaker to make wine in new soil, to learn more about Sangiovese and other indigenous varietals native to Tuscany. I must remember to thank him for his idea."

GAJA - MONTALCINO

Angelo Gaja:

"Elegance is a very difficult concept, it's not so easy to understand. Look at the advertisements over the last 20-30 years. They are usually using the body of a man and a woman without dress. In this case, the body has to be perfect. Sometimes if it is more opulent it can seem better, but be careful! You have to think, the more the body is perfect, the more it can be manipulated.

Elegance doesn't need perfection. So to me, elegant wine doesn't need to be perfect. It shouldn't be perfect. It is actually the imperfections in wine, the acidity, the tannins... these are what make the wine better and gives authenticity to the wine."





SESTA DI SOPRA- MONTALCINO

Ettore Spina - Owner & Winemaker:

"The winery was started by my wife, Enrica, and myself on our vacation property Montalcino from vines we planted 20 years earlier. We didn't want to complicate things so we only planted Sangiovese Grosso because we knew we could eventually sell off the grapes.

1999 was our first vintage and we were so surprised to get such amazing recognition. And we continue to be delighted with our continued support and reputation. This is never our objective, but we are flattered none the less. We make less than 12,000 bottles total which allows my wife to pamper our vines the same way she does with our children. Sometimes I even find her picking off all of the damaged grapes, one by one with tweezers."

PODERE IL CASTELLACCIO- BOLGHERI

Alessandro Scappini, owner & winemaker Podere Il Castellaccio: Our vineyard is situated in Castagneto Carducci, in the Livorno area of Tuscany. We founded the winery in 2009, but the estate has belonged to my family since the 1960s while my grandparents used the land to make wine and sell the grapes.

We only have 3.5 hectares and our vines have an average age of 40 years. The older vineyards, occupying more than 2 hectares are planted to Tuscan natives: Sangiovese, Ciliegiolo, Foglia Tonda and Pugnitello. In 2014 almost a hectare of Cabernet Franc was planted and this vineyard is sited on steep hillside terrace.

Two years ago we made a request to obtain organic certification, which we achieved in 2018. We are now also a certified biodynamic producer. It's very important to us to make wines that are healthy and reflect our past while looking towards the future.



CA' MARCANDA ®



GAJA- BOLGHERI

Ca' Marcanda - It took so long (18 trips in all) to complete negotiations for the 1996 purchase of historic 250-acre Bolgheri estate that the Gaja family began to call it "ca' marcanda," the house of endless negotiations, from the Piedmontese dialect ca' (meaning casa or house) and marcandè (meaning mercanteggiare or to haggle).

While Gaja has shown with 'Darmagi' that he can make great Cabernet Sauvignon in Piedmont, he was compelled to try to compete with some of the great names of Italian wine when he arrived in Bolgheri just over 20 years ago. The winery and its vineyards are situated just south of Poggio al Tesoro and Ornellaia.

It took another six years before Gaja would complete the design and construction of a state-of-the-art winemaking facility. Today it is practically completely invisible – and becoming ever more so year after year. This is because the winery is built underground. The Ca' Marcanda winery was built from scratch – and completely dreamed up by Angelo; whereas Piedmont was built over five generations. This new winery was built exactly as he wanted it after 40 years of experience. The layout and design allow for the precision necessary to craft exceptional wines, albeit with minimal intervention.

Ercole Zarrella, Owner & Winemaker:


"After growing up in the vineyards my entire life with my grandparents and parents, as soon as I took over our land the first thing I did was rip out the old vines and plant Fiano. It had just started to become popular as a dry, still wine rather than a sweet, sparkling wine, as it had been known before. My parents thought I was crazy, that Fiano was a fad that would soon die.

After 15 years of increasing popularity and selling the grapes to other producers, I decided I wanted to make my own wine. That was in 2004. Every year I am learning more, studying more. It's important to me as an artisanal producer to make the best wine I can from my land. That doesn't mean more but to constantly improve the wines we have, the vines, etc. And now my daughter has graduated from enology school and is helping in the cellar. I couldn't be happier."

CAMILUCCI - FRANCIACORTA

Camilucci and his wines are one of a kind and such a pleasure to have as part of our portfolio. We met Stefano several years ago at a wine fair where he first presented his exceptional Franciacorta. Before even pouring the first glass, you could hear the passion and the enthusiasm that Stefano has for his native territory and the wines that reflect it.

"In the tiny commune of Rodengo-Saiano Stefano Camilucci farms 18ha of vines organically on ancient, morainic, fossil-rich soils. He is making some of the most interesting and delicious Franciacorta wines we have ever tasted by doing exactly the opposite of what most other producers do. He never employs high levels of dosage or malolactic fermentation in production. His singular focus is creating laser-focused fresh, pure, complex wines that allow their place of origin to shine and so he enters into a very risky game of chicken with mother nature every year by harvesting every berry used in his wines late and then laying the fruit bare in the wines without high levels of residual sugar, oak, or malolactic fermentation to hide a flaw or soften a corner. It is a risky endeavor, but we would not want it any other way."- Le Storie Wines

Elisabetta Pala, Owner & Winemaker:

"This winery was my dream. I used to walk these vineyards with my grandfather and my father as a little girl. I never had any other dream except to make wines that truly express the character of my land.

That is why I have chosen the bottle and labels that we did, using the female Morish found on the Sardinian flag. I believe our mascot on the label is a woman strongly linked to the memory and tradition of her land but always with an eye to the outside world."

Aromas of white spring flower, tropical fruit, Mediterranean brush and sea breeze almost jump out of the glass. The juicy palate shows more restraint but reflects the nose, doling out pineapple, grapefruit and a tangy saline note alongside tangy acidity. It closes on a bitter-almond note.

Nicola Ferrari, co-owner and winemaker: In our wines you will find the true essence of the expression "terroir", aromas, colors, reflections; like a photo imprinted in your mind.

These are the distinctive characteristics of Monte Santoccio, a family-run winery that extends for 4 hectares in one of the most beautiful hills of the Valpolicella: Monte Santoccio in Fumane. Winemaker Nicola Ferrari at the age of 26 began his experience at the prestigious Giuseppe Quintarelli winery, and since 2011 has cared for every aspect of his family's Monte Santoccio label at every level from vineyard to glass.

GIANNI TESSARI - SOAVE



Gianni Tessari, owner and winemaker:

Producing a Soave DOC means to interpret not just the oenological characteristics but first of all the essence that an oenologist, like a sculptor, must extract from the grapes. It is being a wine of the origins, of traditions. About the history of a territory. Between the aromas of white flowers and light straw yellow color, emanates powerfully a sensation of familiarity: each sip is a memory, something known and already lived through.

Gianni was born in 1963 in Brognoligo, in the suburbs of Monteforte d'Alpone, province of Verona, and worked in the family vineyards from a very young age. After graduating from the Agricultural Institute he started working inside the winery, experimenting and learning what no book can teach: passion, curiosity, desire to discover and reach new goals. 2013 saw Gianni branch out on his own to create his own family label with his wife Annamaria and daughter Valeria. Gianni farms and crafts wines from three Veneto DOC - Lessini Durello, Colli Berici, and Soave. We love all the wines, but chose to start with the Soave DOC, which Gianni has described most poetically.

LINEA RETTA - GIORGIO RIVETTI AND LARRY CHERUBINO

A collaboration between Italy's Giorgio Rivetti of La Spinetta and Western Australia's own Larry Cherubino. The name 'Linea Retta' is an Italian expression meaning 'in a direct line' and refers to the two renowned winemakers' shared 'vineyard first' winemaking philosophy.

Giorgio works by the principle that 90% of a wine is made in the vineyard, and considers himself a traditionalist. He works with no herbicides or other chemicals and regards the use of barriques and rotofermenters not as instruments for making modern wine but for preserving the quality of the juice produced by the vineyards. Since leading the family's charge into red wines when he made a Barbera d'Asti in 1985, La Spinetta has become a leading force in both Piedmont and Tuscany.

Larry Cherubino has worked for or consulted to some of the biggest names in the world of wine, but it is under his own Cherubino labels that he explores the regions of Western Australia his way. He employs both traditional methods perfected over decades of winemaking, as well as throwing out the rulebook and bucking convention. His sustainably farmed sites grow classic varieties, as well as embracing less-familiar grapes with a big emphasis on Italian varietals.

The decision to make wine in Sicily came after a very long adventure as a tourist in Sicily. From the theatre where the Ancient Greeks invented La Tragedia to the modern masterpiece of Gibellina, Il Cretto di Burri, every stone in Sicily has a story. REMOISSENET PÈRE ET FILS - BOURGOGNE

Remoissenet Père et Fils is a reference point for refined Burgundy wines. This ancient estate, connected by mortar and stone to the medieval walls of Beaune, is linked by vine and bottle to Burgundy's hallowed past and its exciting future. In 2005, Remoissenet started the next chapter in its generations long history. With new owners and renewed leadership under Pierre-Antoine Rovani (formerly of The Wine Advocate) and head winemaker Claudie Jobard whose father is a renowned viticulturalist in Rully and mother was oenologist for Joseph Drouhin. The vines are farmed according to biodynamic principles, and Claudie's winemaking philosophy is non-interventionist, to let the grapes speak as clearly as possible.

DOMAINE PHILIPPE GILBERT - MENETOU-SALON

A neighbour of Sancerre, close to the Loire Valley, the Menetou-Salon appellation covers a modest area of 600 hectares. Menetou-Salon AOC is exclusively planted with pinot noir for the reds and sauvignon blanc for the whites. The Gilbert family have been cultivating their Menetou-Salon vineyards on the famous Kimmeridgian soils for over 250 years . Philippe Gilbert have 30ha under vine that are farmed biodynamically (Biodyvin certified since 2007) with the belief that a living wine is only obtained by respecting the vine and the soil and being receptive to cosmic influences. Observation of the plots, tasting the grapes, gentle handing, indigenous yeast ferments, and experienced intuition has resulted in a range of rich and harmonious wines.

DOMAINE LES 4 VENTS - CROZES-HERMITAGE

Winemaker Lucie Fourel:

We strive to respect the environment. Our work in the vineyard and the cellars simply seeks to help the grapes and the wine to reflect their true character.


In 2006, vigneronne Lucie Fourel started farming 4ha of vines in Crozes-Hermitage originally planted by her grand-parents, and released her first vintage of Les 4 Vents in 2010. It wasn't long before her sister Nancy decided to join her. In 2015 their parents, who were also growers in Crozes-Hermitage and supplied grapes to Cave de Tain l'Hermitage, retired and Lucie and Nancy acquired an extra 6ha from their folks. All Les 4 Vents' 10ha in Crozes-Hermitage (made up mostly of old-vines 30-50yrs) are farmed biodynamically by Lucie and Nancy and certified organic. The sisters' focus in the winery is to capture the terroir through hand-harvested fruit, indigenous yeasts, minimal intervention, and absolutely no additions in the winemaking with just a smidge of sulfur at bottling (<10ppm to <20ppm), which is why they are often spotted at Raw Wine and other Bio/Biodynamic/natural-wine shows.

ÉRIC LEGRAND - CELLES SUR OURCE - COTE DES BAR (AUBE) - GROWER CHAMPAGNE

A son of an Aubois winemaker, Éric inherited not only the vineyards but also a love for his viticultural heritage and has successfully expanded to a 12 hectare estate comprised of 35 % Chardonnay, 50 % Pinot Noir, 10 % Pinot Blanc and 5 % Meunier grown on the clay-limestone soils of the Côte des Bars. The organically managed vineyards are on south and south-east facing slopes that are lulled by the nurturing rays of the sun from morning until late afternoon. All the estate's Champagne is made exclusively from grapes grown by the family.

We were lucky to receive an allocation of just one wine this year, the Bulle de Folie (bubbles of madness), and hope to be able to offer you more very soon.




DOMAINE KIRRENBOURG - ALSACE - GRAND CRU SCHLOSSBERG

Domaine Kirrenbourg is privelige to two illustrious granite-soil Grand Cru Alsace terroirs, Schlossberg (7 ha under vine) and Brand (3 ha under vine). The Schaetzel family have a long history in the region which Kirrenbourg is built upon. Martin Schaetzel started to bottle his own wine in the early 1930s and his expertise in the vines and the cellar was passed down the generations. More recently Jean Schaetzel switched to Organic and Biodynamic viticulture in 1998 and now leads the Kirrenbourg wine team: "Biodynamic culture is the most effective way of persuading vines to dig down deep, while helping them also to 'reach for the stars'. The grapes they produce are unique, a perfect mirror of the terroir, giving peerlessly authentic wines."



CHATEAU DE SALES - POMEROL

Chateau de Sales is still run by the same family as it was almost five centuries ago, passed down from generation to generation ever since 1578, when it was acquired by the Sauvanelle family. Château de Sales is located in the northwest of the Pomerol appellation with 47.6 hectares under vine. The majority of vines are Merlot (73%) which, combined with Cabernet Sauvignon (15%) and Cabernet Franc (12%), finds its full expression in a terroir of gravel and heat-retaining sand which also contains iron oxide. In the vineyard the soil is regularly tilled, and organic viticulture and biodiversity is practiced to promote soil and vine health. The grapes are harvested by hand at optimum maturity for each parcel.

VIGNOBLES DESPAGNE - NAUJAN ET POSTIAC , ENTRE DEUX MERS, BORDEAUX

Despagne have been established in Bordeaux, in the heart of Entre-Deux-Mers, for more than 200 years. A family run estate in Naujac-Postiac (well off the beaten Bordeaux path) that has managed to find a place among the biggest names in Bordeaux thanks to innovative know-how, both in terms of its terroirs and winemaking. The limestone terroir in the southwest, made up of limestone deposits, surrounded by streams reveals gravelly terraces, atypical soils and a unique and wonderful wine-growing landscape where Despagne are able to find some exceptional terroirs.

CHÂTEAU LES RUATS - PIAN SUR GARONNE - CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

Château Les Ruats is located in the tiny village of Pian Sur Garonne at the southern end of the Gironde on the right bank. Founded in 1992 by Joël Richard, Château les Ruats extends over 12 hectares encompassing the Côtes de Bordeaux and Côtes de Bordeaux Saint-Macaire appellations. Coming from a line of passionate winegrowers spanning three generations, Joël Richard developed his skills within the oenological institutions of Bordeaux, and honed his skills in Pomerol and Saint-Émilion. Richard practices sustainable/organic viticulture, and practices minimal intervention both in the vineyard and in the cellar in order to allow nature to fully express itself. The vines are planted on clay-limestone soil and benefit from an oceanic climate on the sunny hillside slopes that overlook the Garonne river. The varietals planted are mainly Merlot and Cabernet Franc as well as some Cabernet Sauvignon and Sauvignon Blanc. Each vintage bears a distinct identity and is produced with the greatest standards by Joël Richard.

CHÂTEAU LATOUR-LAGUENS - SAINT MARTIN DU PUY - BORDEAUX SUPERIEUR

Founded in the 14th century, Château Latour-Laguens covers 30 hectares and has been producing wines from the Bordeaux Supérieur appellation for centuries. Since 2020, Joël Richard, the new director of the estate, brings his know-how acquired within the oenological institutions of Bordeaux, as well as his experience as a Grand Cru winemaker in Pomerol and Saint-Émilion. The vineyard consists exclusively of red grape varieties, namely Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Malbec and Carménère. The clay-siliceous soil, resting on asteria limestone, offers a terroir comparable to that of the most renowned Grands Crus of Saint-Émilion. It gives rise to deep and elegant wines, characterized by a beautiful aromatic complexity and a velvety tannin structure. Richard employs sustainable viticulture to allow the vines the freedom to reveal their potential. The harvest is carefully sorted by hand, retaining only the best berries, resulting in pure and refined wines. Each plot is fermented and aged separately, then tasted to define the final blends of each vintage. Only in the best years is the exceptional La Réserve made.

CHÂTEAU SIGALAS RABAUD - SAUTERNES

Château Sigalas Rabaud has been in the Sigalas family since 1863 and through six generations. It is perfectly situated on a small hill overlooking Chateau d'Yquem, just 500 metres away. With just fourteen hectares, it is the smallest of all the premier cru classé Sauternes properties. Planted on a slight slope facing south, the vine grows on the famous "Sauternais terrace" characterized by a clay bedrock, covered with silico-gravelly soil deposited by the Garonne 600,000 years ago. Vineyard plantings consist of 85% Semillon and 15% Sauvignon.

The current sixth generation, Laure de Lambert Compeyrot wants to pass on a living soil to future generations through organic viticulture and preserving biodiversity and old-vine heritage.
